Themes for Next School Year

Ms. Garrido would like the SDMC to decide on next school year's theme by the next meeting, scheduled for May 2, 2009. She submitted the following recommendation and asked the committee to bring forth any new idea or their support for any of the following:

- Discovering the Treasure in our Students (from treasure map to treasure chest)
- Constructing Life-Long Learners (from foundation to skyscrapers)

Other Concerns brought by SDMC Members from their teams:

The following items were brought forth from Ms. Atkins and Coach Jones:

- Kitchen Director – for our next Spaghetti Supper, a kitchen director is needed that holds no duty other than making sure that there is efficiency in cooking and serving. All members agreed.
- Schedule Friday's Duty – while each department did send representatives to begin cooking on Friday, a schedule should be developed so that not any one person has to stay too late. All members agreed.
- Talent Show – Since all auditions were handled by the ancillary team during cluster time, the Talent Show should always be assigned to the Ancillary Team. All members agreed.

- Vegetables – More tomatoes and lettuce must be added to the “secret recipe.” All members agreed.
- More Games – It appears that there were more snack booths than games; more carnival rides like the carnival rides Ms. Garrido provided for perfect attendance last year. It was also mentioned that prizes should begin to be collected from the beginning of the school year (from party supply stores and the dollar stores). All members agreed.
- Volunteers – The student volunteers from Fonville Middle School were a great help with keeping the grounds clean. We must send thank you letters to the students and their teacher.
- DJ – We should look for DJs who would like to promote their business so that we can have music in the cafeteria during the spaghetti supper.
- Detention – a concern was brought that students with assigned detention were left with no teacher on Monday, April 6. Ms. Garrido mentioned that this was a manpower issue and that as far as she knows this is the first time it happened. Ms. Garrido also mentioned that detention, like any other reprimand, must be effective in order to continue using it. We must look at the root of the problem; in other words, what are they doing that is making them earn detention?
